June beekeeping notes ~ written by Pat Allen

We are still deep in the swarming season. Keep a watch, colonies that have seemed quiet up till now may decide to swarm this month. Remember when you take off the spring crop of honey to replace the supers so that the bees have lots of space.

Oil seed rape honey needs to be removed as soon as capped, or even if still uncapped so long as the honey is ripe. Make sure though, that you leave the bees enough stores — populations are still rising at this time of year, lots of mouths to feed.

If you've done splits for swarm control let's hope for good weather for the new queens to mate well. Give a virgin queen up to 28 days to start laying, but do not wait longer or you may end up with laying workers and a doomed colony. If you want a swarm to give you a new colony, let me know, but you must be prepared to collect it, with an experienced beekeeper if you have not done it before.



BBKA Link Trustee – Howard Pool -5th May 2016

Howard explained that each Area Association has a dedicated Trustee, providing a link directly to the BBKA Executive Committee. In his case this covers Buckinghamshire, Gwent, Hertfordshire, Middlesex, Peterborough as well as Essex.

As with all BBKA trustees, in addition to the role providing a link between members or divisions and the Executive Committee, Howard also oversees one of the various sub committees which are responsible for running the activities of the association. In his case this is the Finance committee given his background in accounting. Howard went on to explain some aspects of the BBKA's budget and its finances. He reiterated that, given the scope of its activities and its wide ranging responsibilities the BBKA's budget was really very modest but still running an acceptable surplus as a charitable organisation.

Howard provided a brief overview of the Executive committee and its role and told us that the activities of BBKA are, in the main, managed and delivered by volunteers, the Trustees and the Operations Director / General Secretary with the support of a small administration team based at Stonleigh.

As members of the BBKA we can all use our local Link Trustee for advice, information or assistance. Howard welcomed contact on any matter relevant to the BBKA. The Link Trustee is there to provide us all with support either as an individual, Branch/Division or Area, whether a query relates to constitutional, beekeeping or operational advice or suggestions and feedback.
