October Beekeeping Notes—written by Pat Allen

The weather is cooling rapidly and you should have finished feeding and treating your bees by now. The floor inserts can be removed – check it and note down the varroa count.

Remove the queen excluder!

Assuming you treated your bees against varroa, don't forget that it is a legal requirement to record what you gave them, and to keep the records for five years. For each colony note the product, where you got it, batch number, expiry date, amount used, length of treatment, and disposal of waste.

Your colony will be warmer in winter with a super below the brood box. So if you have a super above the brood box now, swap the boxes to leave the brood box at the top. Close top ventilation (if you have mesh floors) and put some insulation under the roof. Woodpecker guards and mouseguards need to be in place by the end of October.



The Good, the Bad and the Absolutely Useless – 6th September 2018

Jim showed us his uncapping tray. In the corner he had a piece of wood with a saw cut in it. He uses this groove to place his uncapping knife in when not in use, which keeps it well clear of all the sticky cappings.

Pat puts an eke underneath the clearer board when she is clearing the super of bees; this gives them more room. She also showed us a tool which hangs on the end of your hive so that when you take out your first brood frame you can hang the brood frame on the frame hanger to save putting it on the grass or next to the hive.



Pat showed us a half frame which is useful when checking drone brood for varroa.

Also, a tool that someone had made with a magnet on the end, is very useful for picking up drawing pins when you are fumbling around in your box wearing gloves. This is very handy when you are marking a brood frame, for instance, one with a queen cell on it.



We had a discussion of various other unusual useful items from the members.
