February Beekeeping Notes

A bright cold sunny day is ideal to go through your spare frames as wax and propolis will be brittle and will come off easily. Don't give your bees frames with mouldy comb or mouldy pollen which they cannot remove; they like new foundation. Any frames with holes or out of shape, get rid of them but save the wax to render it down later.

On super frames run your hive tool or a scraper over the comb on both sides to break down the old wax and then cut out the old foundation. On old brood combs just cut out the wax and as this will have cocoons, you may find it's not worth trying to salvage any wax, in which case just burn it. If you have an old boiler use a good handful of washing soda in the water and boil the frames, then rinse them in water and leave them to dry. If you have no boiler, just scrape the frames to clean them as best you can.

Don't put new foundation in yet as it is too cold and the wax will be brittle and will break. Leave that job until the weather is warmer. It does not take long to do and you will be ready for any expansion in March.

Jim said that anyone who wanted to come to a committee meeting to see what was involved was welcome to come along. All other posts as before.

It was agreed to hold an Extraordinary General Meeting at the February meeting to approve the accounts and also to consider moving the AGM to February. Notice will be sent to members.
