Varroa Management in 2019 Spoilt for Choice - Robert Smith

Varroa originated from Asia and is responsible for killing millions of honey bees. The varroa mite was first noticed in the British Isles in 1992, when there were limited treatments. Now there are fifteen approved treatments available.

The mite cannot survive without contact with the honey bee whether it be pupae or adult bee. It reduces the life expectancy of the bee and can wipe out full colonies. The mite sucks on the adult bees' fat for energy.

There is a combination of ways to treat varroa. Each treatment has a different way of tackling the varroa mite. The more we know about the varroa mite the better our knowledge to treat it. Some of the chemical treatments get absorbed into the body of the mite, others when contacting the mite have a physical effect on it, while others encourage the defensive conduct of the bee.

A natural way to treat varroa is to dust the bees with icing sugar. The bees clean each other to remove the sugar causing the mites to drop off. Also, the icing sugar prevents the varroa from gripping on to the bee.

Beekeepers need to keep a close watch for the mite in their hives to try to control this dreadful parasite.
