## **May Beekeeping Notes**

A lively swarming season is in prospect if the weather continues warm as it has been through April. There are plenty of drones about and colonies are building up well and fast. There is a good nectar flow **so get those supers on**. Give them some new foundation to work on if you can.

Keep your eyes peeled for queen cells and make sure you have the equipment and plan ready for when you need to split the colony. Be **especially** vigilant if you have not clipped the queen's wings or you may lose a lot of bees.

Plan ahead if you think you may need to extract some honey this month and you need to borrow the division's extractor – book it in good time, you may not be the only one needing it. (Contact details in your information pack.)

May is a good month for a disease inspection. Inspect the combs carefully, shaking off the bees so that you can see every cell (except a frame with a queen cell you want to keep of course, do not shake that frame but brush the bees off instead). If anything is amiss, contact your mentor or Jim McNeill. If you suspect Foul Brood disease, contact also the Bee Inspector (details in *The Essex Beekeeper*). Put in the floor insert for a few days to monitor the varroa drop and be prepared to treat if there is a heavy load.
