

APRIL Beekeeping Notes

The season has begun in earnest. The colonies should build up quite quickly this month, so make sure you have your swarm control plan in place and spare equipment ready. Get those mini-nucs prepared for the spare queen cells!

If you clip your queens, this is the month to do it, and to mark them (2024 colour is green). If you are nervous about the clipping then ask an experienced beekeeper to do it for you.

Keep ahead with supering. You can put a spare super over the crownboard if you are not sure. You can then swap over the crownboard when they go into the super.

What To Do With Bees Wax - 7th March 2024 Julie Mugglestone and Jim McNeill

Jim always uses a Bain Marie when melting wax. It helps to prevent the wax from catching alight. You can use a warming cabinet. Be mindful of the temperature when melting wax. If the wax is 65 degrees it will take all day to melt, it is essential not to overheat the wax as it will turn a dark brown colour and burn.

Wax is a valuable product of the hive. Jim says it is ideal to make rolling candles. If you do not use the wax Jim advised to give it to someone else, even if the wax becomes mouldy. The wax will not be affected by the mould.

Last year Julie and a few other members from Romford spent the day at a class teaching what to do with your wax. They explained the wax must be filtered twice. If you want to sell any of your homemade products you have to obtain a licence, as well as having to list all ingredients used.

Julie made gifts from her wax for Christmas, making lip balms and hand balms. Julie made hand balm using clean wax and coconut oil, sweet almond nut oil or sunflower oil to avoid allergic reactions. The method is to put the three ingredients into the Bain Marie and stir. It all becomes one, you then transfer to a jug and the wax is ready to pour into a mould. You can add essential oils to the wax if you wish.

Lip balms are made by adding sunflower oil and coco butter to the beeswax. Melt the wax in a saucepan. From the saucepan pour melted wax into tin/mould. The lip balm only needs one application on your lips once a day.

To make wax wraps you need material remnants. Wax wraps are used instead of cling film so are much better for the environment. Julie uses Jojoba oil and pine resin (which needs to be heated to a high temperature) and grates the wax. She then just sprinkles the wax on the material, then irons on with it set on heat and by pushing the wax out make sure edges are covered in the wax. This prevents the edges from fraying.


Romford member reported an Asian Hornet.

I have a photo that none of us really want to see. It was taken 21st March in a VW workshop on the A12. I reported it using the Asian Hornet Watch App. It most probably came in on a vehicle from one of our Kent dealerships, but it shows how easily they can spread. It was found dead, but was promptly collected by the National Bee Unit (NBU) to be DNA checked, as it maybe related to a nest already found last year.

It was later confirmed as a worker Asian Hornet, I received a very professional letter from the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) stating that it was a positive identification, along with a unique reference number. To date it hasn't been matched to a known nest through DNA.
